Pentecost

A few years back, I had a pastor who said Pentecost was her favorite day on the Christian calendar because it was all ours. The secular world has not taken over Pentecost like it has Christmas, or Easter, or the day before All Saints day.

William "Papa Bill" Musselman has lived in the Longmont area for more than 60 years. A U.S. Navy veteran, he ran a national construction company out of Longmont.


But most people know Papa Bill for being Santa Claus to generations of kids. He was booked by local parents to deliver presents to kids on Christmas Eve – all of which he did for free.
